**FINAL DOMESTIC RELATIONS ORDER ON PETITION FOR CUSTODY, CHILD
SUPPORT AND DIVISION OF MARITAL ASSETS**

WHEREAS, Plaintiff JENNIFER ZAMARRIPA (hereinafter "Mother" and/or "Wife") and her counsel, and Defendant KENNETH ZAMARRIPA (hereinafter "Father" and/or "Husband") and his counsel having attended mediation and having resolved all issues, and the Court having considered the same, the COURT HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

1.

The parties are the biological parents of one (1) minor child, CHLOE ZAMARRIPA, a female child, born in 2010.

2.

The parties, formerly husband and wife, were divorced by way of a Decree (hereinafter "Decree") entered on or about March 3, 2023, in the case styled Jennifer Zamarripa v. Kenneth Zamarripa, in the Court of Common Pleas of Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, File No. 2020-FC-1253. The Decree dissolved the parties' marriage but did not provide for division of debt or assets, alimony, child support, custody or parenting time.

3.

On April 24, 2023, Mother filed a Petition for Custody, Child Support and Division of Marital Assets ("Petition") with this Court. On July 24, 2023, Father filed his Answer and Counterclaim with this Court.

4.

The parties attended mediation on November 29, 2023 and were able to resolve all issues.

After carefully consideration, the COURT HEREBY ORDERS:

5.

The Settlement Agreement filed with the Court is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Final Order. Each party is ORDERED to comply with the terms and provisions therein.

The Settlement Agreement contains provisions regarding the split of marital property retirement funds. This order shall be recognized as a Domestic relations order allowing for a QDRO dividing marital property that was acquired during the marriage and benefits the former spouse.

6.

CHILD SUPPORT

As required by O.C.G.A. § 19-6-15(m)(1), the Consent Child Support Worksheet, filed with the Court is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Final Order.

The Child Support Addendum, signed by the Court is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Final Order. Each party is ORDERED to comply with the terms and conditions therein.

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 19-6-32, the Court finds that an immediate Income Deduction Order for Award of Child Support is not warranted. However, pursuant to O.C.G.A. §§ 19-6-31, 32 & 33, the recipient of child support has the express right, without notice to the other party, at the time this Final Judgment and Decree is entered or at any time thereafter, to submit a separate Income Deduction Order for Award of Child Support to the Court for immediate entry. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. §§ 19-6-30, 31, 32 & 33, whenever in violation of the terms of this Final Order, there shall have been a failure to make the support payments due hereunder so that the amount unpaid is equal to or greater than the amount payable for one month, the payments required to be made may be collected by the process of continuing garnishment for support and/or by Income Deduction Order for Award of Child Support.

7.

CUSTODY AND PARENTING TIME

The parties shall share joint legal custody of the parties' minor child. Father shall have primary physical custody of the minor child and Mother shall have parenting time with the child, as provided in the Permanent Parenting Plan signed by the parties and entered by the Court, incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Final Order. The drafting mandates of O.C.G.A. § 19-9-1 regarding a permanent parenting plan have been satisfied by said Parenting Plan. Each party is ORDERED to comply with the terms therein.

8.

ATTORNEY'S FEES

Each party shall be responsible for the payment of his or her own attorney's fees.
