FINAL JUDGMENT OF DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE WITH MINOR CHILDREN

Court, having reviewed the file and heard the testimony, makes these findings of fact, and reaches these conclusions of law:

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the parties and the subject matter herein.

2. The Petitioner has been a resident of the State of Florida for at least six (6) months prior to the filing of the Petition for Dissolution of Marriage.

3. The parties were married on November 21, 2005.

4. Irreconcilable differences exist and have caused the irretrievable breakdown of the marriage, and all efforts and hope of reconciliation would be impracticable and not in the best interests of the parties.

5. The parties wish to settle between themselves their respective rights, duties, and obligations regarding property and liabilities, and so have entered into a Marital Settlement Agreement. This Agreement, filed with the court on December 13, 2023, was entered into voluntarily by each party, and has been filed of record and introduced into evidence at the final hearing in this cause.

6. There are three (3) minor children at issue of this marriage:

Name: Leonardo Delgado

Birth date: December 6, 2006

Name: Alejandro Delgado

Birth date: July 25, 2013

Name: Dalhya Delgado

Birth date: November 24, 2015

7. The Court finds that said Marital Settlement Agreement, along with the Time-Sharing Schedule contained therein, constitutes a Parenting Plan intended to govern the relationship between the parties relating to the decisions to be made regarding the children.

8. The Court finds that this Court has continuing jurisdiction over the children pursuant to the applicable Florida Statutes and the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act.

9. The Court finds that Florida is the home state and the state of habitual residence of the children. Accordingly, Florida is the sole jurisdictional state to determine child custody, parental responsibility, time-sharing, rights of custody, and rights of access concerning the children under the Parental Kidnapping Prevention Act (PKPA), under the International Child Abduction Remedies Act (ICARA), and under the Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction enacted at The Hague on October 25, 1980.

10. The Court finds that the parties have the present ability to pay support as agreed to in the Marital Settlement Agreement as ratified, confirmed, and made part of this Final Judgment.

IT IS, therefore, **ORDERED** and **ADJUDGED** as follows:

1. The parties are awarded Judgment for Dissolution of Marriage, and the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between CRISTIAN DELGADO (hereinafter referred to as "Husband") and REYNA CRISTINA DELGADO (hereinafter referred to as "Wife") are hereby dissolved.

2. The Marital Settlement Agreement of the parties, filed with the court on December 13, 2023, and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes, are approved and expressly made a part of this Final Judgment for Dissolution of Marriage, and all of the terms and provisions of said Agreement are **RATIFIED, CONFIRMED, and ADOPTED** as Orders of this Court to the same extent and with the same force and effect as if its terms and provisions were set forth verbatim in this Final Judgment, and the parties are **ORDERED** to comply with the terms and provisions of said Agreement.

3. Each party shall (a) provide to the other party any necessary information or to execute and/or deliver any instrument or document necessary to transfer title or interest in property consistent with this Final Judgment or the Marital Settlement Agreement, and (b) timely perform such other acts that are reasonably necessary or that may be reasonably requested by the other party to effectuate the provisions of this Final Judgment or the Marital Settlement Agreement.

4. The Respondent/Wife, REYNA CRISTINA DELGADO, is restored to her maiden name, and it is ordered that her name is changed to REYNA CRISTINA BALDEON, by which the Respondent/Wife shall hereafter be known.

5. The Petitioner's counsel, Alcides J. Martinez, Esq., and Respondent's counsel, Norma Pacheco, Esq., are hereby discharged and relieved from further liability and responsibility in this matter.

6. The Court expressly retains jurisdiction of this cause for the purposes of enforcing or modifying the terms of this Final Judgment and the terms of the Marital Settlement Agreement entered into by the parties herein.
