FINAL JUDGMENT OF DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

THIS CAUSE came before the Court on October 5, 2023 for Final Hearing upon the Petitioner/Wife, LISA MCDULIN’s Petition for Dissolution of Marriage and Other Relief and Respondent/Husband, WILLIAM MCDULIN’s Answer and Counter-Petition for Dissolution of Marriage and Other Relief to same and the Court being fully advised in the premises, finds as follows:

- A. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties in this action for dissolution of marriage.
- B. The parties have resided in the State of Florida for more than six months immediately prior to the filing of the Wife’s Petition for Dissolution of Marriage and Other Relief and Husband’s Counter-Petition for Dissolution of Marriage and Other Relief.
- C. The parties were married to each other on February 9, 1991, in Palm Beach Gardens, Palm Beach County, Florida.

D. The parties have no minor children born of this marriage. The Wife is not pregnant, no further issue is contemplated, and no children have been adopted during the marriage.

E. The parties entered into a Marital Settlement Agreement dated September 20, 2023, filed on September 21, 2023(DE#39) which settled all of the issues in this action including but not limited to equitable distribution, alimony, and attorney's fees. The Marital Settlement Agreement is approved, ratified, and incorporated into this Final Judgment by reference, but not merged herein, and was freely entered into by both parties.

F. Beginning Friday, October 6, 2023 and continuing on the first Friday of each month thereafter, the Husband shall pay the Wife durational alimony of \$1,384.00 for 294 months or twenty-four and one-half years. The Husband shall pay the durational alimony for a total of 294 months. The alimony shall be modifiable as provided by Florida Law.

G. By no later than September 29, 2023, the Husband shall pay the Wife temporary support for the month of September in the amount of \$1,384.00. Payment shall be made directly to the Wife by the Husband.


H. The Husband shall pay his monthly alimony obligation via direct automatic deposit to the Wife on the first Friday of each month. In the event the Husband fails to pay the Wife within fifteen days of the first Friday of any given month, the Husband's payments shall thereafter be through income deduction, pursuant to an Income Deduction Order which the Wife may seek immediately.

I. The marriage between the parties is irretrievably broken.

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

1. The marriage of the parties is dissolved as it is irretrievably broken, and each spouse is herein restored to the status of being single and unmarried.
2. The Marital Settlement Agreement entered into by the parties on September 20, 2023 is hereby ratified and incorporated into this Final Judgment by reference, but not merged herein, and the parties are ordered to abide by the terms therein.
3. That the Court retains jurisdiction of this case to enforce or modify the terms of the Marital Settlement Agreement, and this Final Judgment of Dissolution of Marriage, and for any purpose stated in the Marital Settlement Agreement.
